Federico Contigiani, President of Hickory Chair, explored the vast archive in the Liberty Design House. Exploring the archive with Liberty's in-house archivist and design teams, distinguished patterns were selected to create this special collection of fabrics. In addition, an elegant velvet or linen from Liberty was chosen as

the perfect complement for each specific pattern. Lastly, the color palette for each design was selected to complement Hickory Chair's existing textile offering to delight its loyal customers. We believe this beautiful collection of bespoke Liberty fabrics expand this position while elegantly complementing both our existing Hickory Chair textile and extensive furniture assortment."

"From our initial meeting with Federico and the Hickory Chair team to seeing Liberty's interior fabrics brought to life on beautifully crafted silhouettes, it has been an inspiring project," shares Genevieve Bennett, Head of Design, Liberty Interiors. "Creating specifically for the American market, our design team worked to carefully reimagine beloved prints in exciting new colorways exclusively for Hickory Chair. This partnership honors Liberty's 150 years of heritage, while celebrating the enduring synergy between timeless textiles and distinguished craftsmanship."

The spectacular collection includes bespoke colorways of Liberty designs including *Lady Kristina* that was crafted from a series of exquisite hand-painted artworks from the 1920s and 30s. Stately Lady Kristina features a floating arrangement of detailed rose, tulip and blossom flower bouquets. The magnificent landscapes of *Floating Pavillion*



were inspired by traditional Chinese wallpaper panels from the 17th and 18th centuries that is populated with oversized lotus flowers, pavilions, floating sampans and birds in flight. A luxurious velvet and elegant linen have been created from Floating Pavillion. Butterfield velvet is a quintessential Liberty design and features a playful poppy pattern that was taken from original artwork designed in the 1900's by one of Liberty's most influential Arts & Crafts designers, Lindsay Butterfield. Faria Flowers velvet is a hand-drawn and hand-painted large scale floral design that was inspired by the Royal Chelsea and Hampton Court gardens by talented Liberty Fabric designers. Sambourne Stripe is a linen print available in two distinctive colorways that was inspired by decorative shawls from the 1900's featuring intricate floral motifs from Sambourne Vine. Lutea is a simple yet versatile floral geometric linen fabric in two color ways that was inspired by the lily-pad motif from a beloved Liberty scenic fabric. Porcelain Trail is an elegant linen print that was inspired by a hand-painted furnishings

floral design with winding branches dotted with flowers and exquisitely drawn chrysanthemums. Lotus Garden is inspired by an original artwork from Liberty's extensive archive. Layered with an exquisite variety of Asian-inspired motifs, the original design features calm waters peppered with blooming irises, peonies, and chrysanthemums, watched over by handsome Kingfishers.

This exclusive, bespoke fabric collection will be available at select trade showrooms.
