### **Summary:**

**This position is responsible for leading and operating various woodworking machinery to produce upholstery frame parts.**

### **Essential Duties and Responsibilities include the following:**

- **Must have the ability to answer questions from co-workers in regards the product or sets, assist as needed.**
- **Must be able to setup and operate a Hauncher as well as a Mortice Tenon.**
- **Must check co-workers set-ups for safety and quality.**
- **Must have the ability to make parts from shop orders and/or patterns.**
- **Required to set up and operate inverted router and router.**
- **Must be able to set up and operate the CNC trim and bore and the Richardson trim and bore, and multiple boring machines.**
- **Required to set up and operate the bandsaw and variety saw.**
- **Must be able to set up and operate the profile shaper, Bell 100 and Bell 24.**
- **Required to use a tape measure to verify measurements on the wood.**
- **Must be able to set up and run a planer, wide belt sander and a rip saw.**
- **Must follow all safety policies and procedures**
- **All other duties as assigned**
